 - **Fear** – Of being judged or not being good enough.
 - **Lack of planning** – No structure leads to aimless work.
 - **Comparison** – Looking sideways instead of forward.
 - **Giving up too soon** – Breakthroughs often come *after* a breakdown.

How to Cope with Failure

- Acknowledge it
- Take a break, but don't quit
- Talk about it with others
- Reframe it
- Try again—smarter, stronger, bolder
